

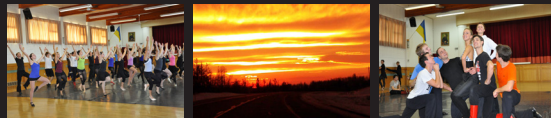

Vasyl Kanevets

Vasyl received his Professional Dancer Diploma at the National Ballet School of Kiev. He also completed his Honours level Ballet Master's Degree in Kyiv. In 1995, Vasyl moved to Canada where he continues to work as a professional dance instructor and choreographer. Vasyl is also the Vice-President of the Vaganova Dance Society in Edmonton and the current Artistic Director of Tryub Ukrainian Dance Ensemble of Calgary.

Vincent Rees

Vincent has been impassioned with Ukrainian dance and culture for most of his life. As a dancer, teacher, and choreographer he has performed, travelled, taught, and adjudicated throughout western Canada. Recently, Vincent has completed his M.A. in Ukrainian Folklore from the University of Alberta.

Anna graduated from the Institut of Culture in Kiev with an Honours Level Ballet Master's degree. Prior to arriving in Canada, Anna held a professorship at the Kiev College of Culture for eleven years, where she instructed subjects that included Composition of Dance, Ukrainian and Character Dance, and History of Costume. Anna moved to Canada in 1996 and has held the title of Artistic Director of numerous Ukrainian dance schools. Anna has also been the adjudicator of the Vaganova Dance Society Ballet exams and several Ukrainian dance festivals.
